SEA TO SKY CORRIDOR

Pemberton, BC / Squamish, BC / Whistler, BC

Rugged and almost overwhelmingly beautiful, the region known as the Sea to Sky Corridor will satiate anyone's thirst for adventure. Skiing, snowboarding, mountain biking, sailing, rock climbing, hiking, camping, golf - all these activities and more are abundantly accessible in the Sea to Sky Corridor.

The Corridor comprises a fast-growing area that stretches north of Vancouver from Furry Creek to D'Arcy. Major centres include Squamish, with close to 15,000 residents, the resort destination of Whistler, with approximately 10,000 full-time residents, and Pemberton, home to approximately 8,000. Several First Nations communities are part of the Sea to Sky mosaic. The Corridor is a recreational Mecca, and visitors can swell the population of Whistler to 100,000 in the busy season.

Healthcare Facilities

Squamish General Hospital is a 25-bed acute care, medical/surgical hospital supported by diagnostic laboratory and imaging departments, as well as physiotherapy and social work services. It provides emergency, ambulatory, inpatient, maternity, anesthetic and general surgery care. Visiting specialists augment our general practitioner care with consultation and some surgical services. Tertiary care is available in nearby Vancouver and North Vancouver. The hospital supports

joint community programs such as a diabetic day care, arthritis rehabilitation, pre-natal classes and cardiovascular disease prevention.

Hilltop House in Squamish is a 61-bed residential care facility for seniors with complex needs. It provides home-like care for its permanent residents, as well as respite care, a community bathing program and adult day care for seniors.

Whistler Health Care Centre is a busy diagnostic and treatment centre that serves up to 140 patients a day in the busiest season. It is also an emergency and ambulatory care centre. Our staff specialize in treating sports related injuries, as well as stabilizing trauma and critical care patients for transfer to Lower Mainland hospitals. The Centre has no overnight stay capacity, but does have an on-call system. Medical care in Whistler is augmented by general medical practices and a walk-in clinic.

Pemberton Health Centre is a smaller diagnostic and treatment centre staffed by resident general practitioners and registered nurses who serve small population pockets spread out over a wide area. There is no inpatient stay capacity and the nurses take first call. Serious conditions are stabilized and transported via air or road ambulance to Lower Mainland hospitals.
