Expand your career in vibrant and culturally diverse community settings as a member of a multidisciplinary team assigned to one of six health areas. Community Health staff provide direct and contracted services including:

- Home and community care
- Mental health services
- Population and preventative health
- Addictions services
- Aboriginal health services
- Primary care clinics
- HIV services
- Residential care

Adult & Older Adult Program - This program area is served by home care nurses, case managers, intake workers, clinic nurses, hospital/community liaison nurses and hospice shift care nurses.

Infant, Child & Youth Program – With a focus on population health, nurses provide services in homes, childcare facilities, clinics, schools and other community sites in two program areas: Healthy Beginnings/Early Childhood (0-5 years) or Children/Youth (5 years and older).

Community Mental Health Services – To meet the needs of people of all ages with serious mental illness and/or behavioural disorders, RNs and RPNs provide assertive outreach, crisis intervention, assessment, medications, counselling and psychosocial rehabilitation, as well as family education and support.

Withdrawal Management & Addiction Services – As the cornerstone of the withdrawal management system in Vancouver, the Vancouver Detox Centre provides Daytox, sobering services and residential detox beds. Nurses provide assessments, medications, treatment, counselling, and education.

Registered Nurses

Working independently within established frameworks, Community Health Nurses apply a client-centred and collaborative approach to provide high-quality assessment, planning, intervention and evaluation services.

Rehabilitation Careers

Physiotherapists (PTs) and Occupational Therapists (OTs) provide services to clients in private homes, group homes or residential facilities. Within Community Health Services, PTs and OTs work in either the Adult & Older Adult Program or the Infant, Child & Youth Program. Within Community Mental Services, OTs provide rehabilitation services to clients with serious mental illnesses, within the context of age-based programs (Adult, Geriatrics, Family and Children).

Community Mental Health Workers

Community Mental Health Workers provide crisis intervention, psychiatric assessment, case management, counselling and placement services. Qualifications include a Master's degree in a Behavioral Science followed by a minimum of three years' relevant psychiatric experience.

Clinical & Clerical Support

An array of casual opportunities exists for Licensed Practical Nurses, Pharmacy Technicians and Health Unit Workers for our inner city core, as well as various casual clerical support positions.
