Subject: Influenza Immunization and Reporting

Getting the flu shot will be an important step to protect yourself and those around you. It can help keep your health care team strong and your family healthy.

A flu shot can reduce your chance of developing symptoms that resemble COVID-19 which would require you to get tested and self-isolate. This can increase wait times for test results and delay the identification of COVID-19 cases. The vaccine is the best way to protect against the flu, and flu shots for health care staff are free.

Getting a flu shot

Staff flu clinics have started.

Book your appointment at one.vch.ca/flu

- You can pre-book their immunization appointments at their preferred site location and date online.
- Appointments will be scheduled at intervals
- You will be asked to follow proper hand hygiene upon arrival
- Drop-ins will still be accommodated

The peer immunizer program starts October 12 and offers immunizations to VCH staff and medical staff at their worksite. Immunization appointments are also available at community pharmacies, <u>public health clinics</u> or through your primary care provider. For a list of clinics in B.C., visit <u>ImmunizeBC</u>.
