The Role

Join a team of Oral and Maxillofacial surgeons providing comprehensive call coverage for Vancouver General Hospital along with management of medically complex patients in our outpatient dental clinic. The Department of Dentistry comprises a group of dedicated and collegial providers who provide 24/7 call coverage for the emergency centre along with providing ward consults and dental care both in the operating theatre and outpatient clinic setting. As a centre for tertiary care, we are also responsible for transfers of patients from across the province when local coverage is lacking.

Who We Are

Join a group of six Oral and Maxillofacial surgeons and develop a hospital practice alongside your own community based office work. On call services are provided in a 1 in 6 (or 1 in 7) rotation. You will be part of the Division of Oral and Maxillofacial surgery in the Department of Dentistry with a talented, dedicated and collegial group who work together to provide excellent patient care. Your role will include emergency consultations / surgical care – both elective and emergency, in patient care for trauma and infection patients and, in time, access to elective

surgical time both at UBC and VGH. You will also be involved in the teaching of dental residents while on rotation at VGH.
