

Patient Access to clinical documents in Health Gateway.

What is clinical documentation?

Notation in a patient's chart about a patient's medical condition or treatment. Examples: discharge summary, consult notes, operative report, etc.

What are we aiming to do?

Enable online patient access to some health authority clinical documents, at the provider's discretion. Clinical documents are <u>not</u> shared automatically with patients.

Not in scope for today's discussion:

What is driving the change?


CARE PROVIDER DEMAND

Some providers have requested the capability to share clinical documents electronically with their patients. They see benefits to enhanced communication and quality of patient care.



PATIENT DEMAND & BENEFITS

Patients highly value the ability to access their health information



I avoided an inperson visit to a doctor and/or emergency room at least once. I can better manage my health because I can access my personal health information.

Patient access to clinical documents in Health Gateway

- Health Gateway clinical documents feature is live as of March 16, 2023 for those sites that use CST Cerner.
- The clinical documents feature in Health Gateway will be expanded to other health authorities, giving patients access to their clinical documents no matter where they received health care in BC.
- Some health authorities already share clinical documents in their patient portals.



Provider Resources

Providers are responsible for ensuring patient-centred clinical documents. When sharing electronically, no one else will review, redact or otherwise modify your documents.

Patient-centred documentation:

- Is inclusive and culturally safe
- Is comprehensive, objective and legible
- Excludes third-party personal or other sensitive information

Even if you don't share documents electronically, an increasing number of patients are requesting paper copies. Consider the need to write patient-centred documents regardless of whether the document is shared electronically.

Considerations for when to share

You may choose **not** to share clinical documents electronically if:

- You are working in mental health services
 - Sharing clinical notes may be harmful to the patient
- You need to include potentially sensitive third-party information
- For detailed guidance take <u>the e-learning course</u>
- Reminder that whether a document is shared electronically or not, patients can request a paper copy through the Release of Information process
 - Potentially sensitive 3rd party information will be redacted as per FIPPA guidelines as appropriate
 - Medical jargon, acronyms and other potentially sensitive comments will not be redacted



Document view in Health Gateway

- Clinical documents will appear in the patient's timeline.
- Patients can download a PDF of the report.
- Reports are available in HGW once final signing occurs by author.
- Patients have access to in-app links, resources, and FAQs.




