Mental Health Act (MHA) Involuntary Admissions

New B.C. MHA Form 4

Last month, the Ministry of Health replaced the MHA Form 4 with Form 4.1 (Certification for 48 hours, valid for up to 14 days after assessment), which allows the apprehension, detainment and admission of a person for 48 hours, including in the community, and Form 4.2 (Certification for one month, if applicable), which extends admission for up to one month.

The new forms clearly distinguish each of the four involuntary admissions criteria and are more accessible for clinicians, personcentred, culturally safe, trauma informed, gender affirming and recovery oriented.

Until February 1, 2024, Form 4 remains legally valid for physicians to complete; nurse practitioners are not to complete the old version of Form 4.

MHA Involuntary Admissions expanded scope for nurse practitioners

Effective February 1, 2023, nurse practitioners have legal authority to complete MHA Form 4.1, enabling 48-hour detainment and involuntary psychiatric treatment. Detainment longer than 48 hours will require an assessment and sign-off by a physician using Form

The BC College of Nurses and Midwives (BCCNM) approved revisions to the Nurse Practitioner Scope of Practice relating to changes to the MHA and developed standards to apply when completing mental health or capacity assessments, as well as specific limits and conditions to apply when completing a Form 4.1. MHA Involuntary Admissions Support Team

The VCH/PHC MHA Involuntary Admissions Support Team (MHAforms@vch.ca), which includes clinical educators, clinical resources nurses and a peer support worker, supports clinicians to uphold full legal requirements when involuntarily admitting and providing treatment for people experiencing acute mental health issues.
